



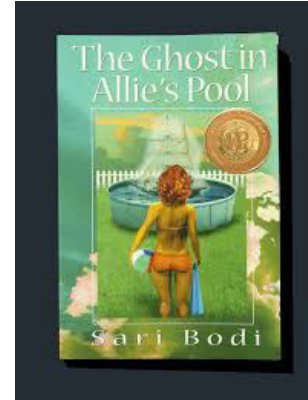
Women Spirit and Imagination

Together, we'll explore examples from Sari's favorite memoirs to see how these writers captured moments in time that were meaningful to them. Then through guided exercises, we'll scribble until we find such moments for ourselves. We'll dig deep to discover the good, the bad, or the messy in-between, perhaps finding an event or a person who contributed to who we are today.

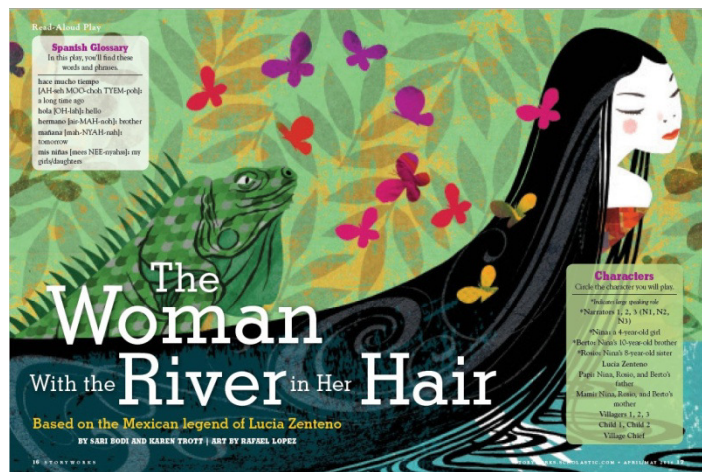


Sari's middle-grade novel inspired by a family story
