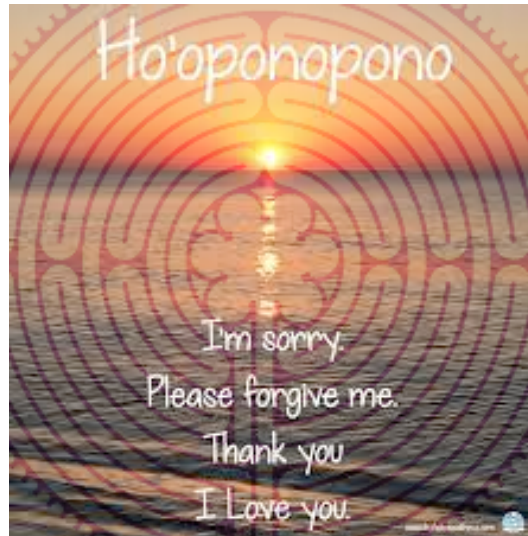

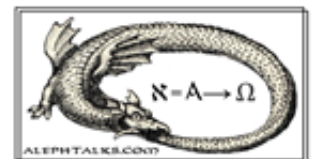

**Ho'oponopono** is an ancient Hawaiian practice of reconciliation and forgiveness: "To put to rights; to put in order or shape, correct, revise, adjust, amend, rectify, to make ready, as canoe-men preparing to catch a wave." It is seen by many  to work on the principles of Energetic Unity  and Empathy to create a Universal Field  of Interconnectedness.

**Labyrinths** have been used for inner contemplation, walking meditation, spiritual healing, and prayer for millennia. The circular paths are designed to encourage transformation and awakening. The transformation can be psychological, personal, or spiritual. They are also used in interpersonal reconciliation work around the world, including in the Middle East.
